



ESCRAVOS GAS TO LIQUIDS PROJECT
CHEMICAL DOSING OPERATION
PREQUALIFICATION

(Operator of the NNPC/CNL Joint Venture)



Chevron Nigeria Limited (CNL), Operator of the NNPC/CNL Joint Venture is installing an onshore gas to liquids processing facility as part of an overall CNL-NNPC JV Western Delta gas program. The Escravos Gas To Liquids (EGTL) plant will be located adjacent to the existing gas processing plant, in an area, which has been reclaimed by dredging, sand filling and dewatering. The CNL/NNPC JV's Escravos operational base is situated approximately 100 miles southeast of Lagos.

Capable Nigerian companies are hereby invited to submit written notification of their desire to pre-qualify for a specific supply and work tender. The subject scope of work regarding your pre-qualification, as referenced above, is **Chemical Supply, Storage, Operations and Maintenance for the EGTL Water Treatment (Chemical Dosing) Operation**, which may include, but not limited to, the following scope items:

- **GENERAL –**
 - Review various plant water specifications and recommend the dosing chemical(s) needed to meet the water specifications.
 - Recommend target concentration and injection volumes for each chemical.
 - Ensure that chemical concentrations and dosing do not exceed design capabilities of the supplied dosing equipment.
 - Supply dosing chemicals required to maintain desired utilities quality.
 - Supply associated process chemicals to maintain continuous and stable operation.
 - Maintain a Nigerian based inventory, near enough to EGTL, for both dosing and process chemicals sufficient to insure no disruption of supply.
 - Order and maintain chemical supplies at designated inventory volumes.
 - Transport chemicals to plant site.
 - Operate & maintain the Water Treatment dosing equipment.
 - Provide technical personnel to sample, test and evaluate the water quality plus recommend and initiate program changes to meet system needs.
 - Work with plant personnel to improve dosing and process chemical usage efficiency.
- **SERVICES**
Provide all required manpower, materials and equipment to perform the Scope of Work.
- **WORK PROGRAM**
In accordance with Exhibit A – Scope of Work Document.
- **CONTROLS / REPORTING REQUIREMENTS**
Issue COMPANY specified reports.
- **SAFETY REGULATIONS**
CONTRACTOR shall comply with all Plant safety regulations.
- **CONFIDENTIALITY**
CONTRACTOR to ensure their employees maintain confidentiality requirements of Plant/Project.
- **CHANGE**
Per COMPANY change procedures.
- **INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS**
CONTRACTOR has full responsibility for all industrial relations of his staff.

NIGERIAN CONTENT

CONTRACTOR shall comply with the Federal Government of Nigeria directives of October 13, 2006, regarding Nigerian Content Development (NCD) which mandates that all contractors create value in country with targets of 45% by end of 2006 and 70% by end of 2010 in terms of total monetary expenditures through the deliberate utilization of Nigerian human and material resources without sacrificing safety, health and environmental standards. In line with these Directives, preference shall be given to Nigerian companies or foreign companies based in Nigeria with a majority owned Nigerian affiliate who demonstrates willingness to execute the work/services to the satisfaction of the NCD requirements and guidelines. Please note that non-submission of evidence demonstrating capability to comply fully with all the NCD requirements shall be considered a "Fatal Flaw" and such defaulting companies shall be disqualified from bidding for this work. Interested Companies Must:

- Provide a Nigerian Content Plan providing a detailed description of the role, work scope, man-hours and responsibilities of all Nigerian companies and personnel that would be involved in executing the work.
- Demonstrate that they are a Nigerian Registered Company, and if this is not the case, the company should be a genuine alliance or joint venture with a Nigerian company with details on scope and responsibilities of parties for this work. Such companies must show evidence of joint venture agreement or memorandum of understanding duly signed by the CEO of both companies including evidence or plans of physical operational presence and set-up in Nigeria. Foreign companies wishing to pre-qualify must identify their local affiliates/partners, indicate the scope of work to be assigned to the local affiliates/partners and also define those aspects of the work to be executed in Nigeria.
- Provide evidence of what percentage of your key management positions is held by Nigerians and what percentage of the total work force are Nigerians. Also, show overall percentage of work to be performed by Nigerian resources relative to total work volume.
- State proposed total scope of work to be conducted by Nigerian personnel (whether contracted directly or under subcontract agreements) with names and addresses including evidences of well equipped offices and workshop; attach past experience of such patronage.
Provide past/present experience/commitment to staff training and development of Nigerian personnel including description of any specific programs in place for transfer of technology and skills to indigenous businesses and Nigerians over the next five (5) years.
- Provide detailed Training Plan for Nigerians on engineering, project management and procurement (including all software to be used, number of personnel, name of organisation providing such training and evidence of past training record).
- Provide exact description of place to domicile engineering and project management activities and procurement centres in Nigeria with physical addresses (not P.O. Box).
- Show ability and manner in which international codes and standards in the industry will be harmonized to support locally manufactured products.
- Provide any further innovative proposals that would enhance Nigerian Content on this project.

Prospective tenderers, including all members of proposed joint ventures and or alliances, are required to complete and submit a comprehensive pre-qualification questionnaire before being allowed to provide a tender (i.e. Contractors will not be allowed to tender unless they complete and submit a pre-qualification questionnaire;

the pre-qualification questionnaire will then be evaluated against criteria pre-established by the project, and only then, (if the required criteria are met), will a Contractor be invited to submit a tender. Failure to submit any or all of the required information in the pre-qualification questionnaire documentation, within the specified time frame, may disqualify an applicant.
